Why have a Lake Plan?

- Preservation of the lake
- Dealing with the quality of lake and life at lake
- Provides a voice for the community
- Supports sustainable development and expresses what this means to your lake
- Provincial government no longer takes responsibility for recreational lakes it's up to us as lake associations to do so
- Lake communities must work co-operatively with municipalities and other government agencies a lake plan process helps this to take place
- Gives lake groups more clout with municipal and other government agencies and can also give a lake association a stronger standing within the lake community itself
- Lake Plan's specific recommendations and identified priorities are a great way to get volunteers involved
- Lake Plans educate people

What is a Lake Plan?

- Community driven/community based plan
- A plan to protect lake/keep what you have already
- Vehicle for best management practices/ action plan for the future
- Collection of data relevant to the lake
- A way to monitor changes on your lake

How do you get Buy-in from your Community?

- Holding meetings, workshops, BioBlitz, Social get-togethers offer food
- Educate why a Lake Plan could be important
- Begins with a lake vision and objectives
- Visioning Session allows lake community to decide what the long-term vision for the lake and its community is. Also, what do you value? What are the concerns? Look for/identify common issues
- Need to draw in all ages
- Cannot be a rushed process typically a lake plan process is spread over about three years.
