Position and Purpose:

The successful applicant will be involved primarily in the Love Your Lake Program at Watersheds Canada. They will be expected to have a general knowledge and/or background in Environmental Science, Biology or Natural Resources, and have some fieldwork experience.

As the Love Your Lake Assistant, your primary task will be to carry out shoreline assessments on waterfront properties within the area. You will be working closely with lake associations and volunteers to execute shoreline assessments and collect data. The data collected will be used to develop unique and tailored reports, which contain information on shoreline health, recommended voluntary actions for improvements, and resources for further information. The Love Your Lake Program is designed to support and encourage lake-wide communities to protect and enhance their shoreline and lake health.

The successful applicant will also be involved with raising shoreline property owner awareness of water stewardship principles and environmental impacts on lakes within the area. Other activities include attending community events, delivering educational materials to landowners, and participating in shoreline naturalizations.

Primary Responsibilities:

- Enter data into a secure database for reporting
- Answer questions regarding data collection, shoreline property reports and general program inquires

- Represent the program, the proponent and partners at local fairs, AGMs and other environmental events
- Assist in the distribution of information packages and surveys to residents of targeted lakes
- Solicit information from residents, attendees of local events, etc. that may contribute to data collection activities
- · Writing of individual property reports for each property surveyed using a template
- Assist with communication functions for Watersheds Canada as needed
