


Media release 19th Annual Lake Links workshop moves online, brings together over 150 lake stewards

Lake Links Planning Committee – On October 24, 2020, lake stewards from five provinces and three countries participated in the first-ever online Lake Links workshop.

Due to current health guidelines and the safety of attendees, the 19th Annual Lake Links workshop was held exclusively online. Lake Links attracts citizens and scientists to share ways to help sustain their lakes and rivers. Expert speakers, breakout sessions, and dynamic presentations focus on the lake and river issues that matter most to attendees.

The theme of the 19th Annual Lake Links was "Effective Engagement for Positive Action", and featured presentations from the University of Ottawa, Federation of Ontario Cottagers' Associations, and Rideau Valley Conservation Authority.
