The successful applicant will contribute to the stewardship and outreach work at Watersheds Canada by working to raise landowner awareness of water stewardship principles and environmental impacts on lakes, rivers, and shorelines. The Technician is responsible for:

- creating digital outreach materials and resources (blogs, infographics, videos, etc.);
- education resource creation including scheduled social media posts;
- conducting program evaluations and subsequent reports;
- prepare copy for marketing and education materials;
- communicating with multiple/diverse audiences;
- promote our programs and engage new landowners through online communication channels (newsletters, blogs, articles, etc.);
- act as a spokesperson for the organization and our programs, the proponent and partners at online environmental events including Zoom events;
- assist with data entry, administration, and analysis, including gathering testimonials and evaluation data and documentation of activities and reporting;
- assist in the distribution of information packages and surveys;
- support other project components and staff as assigned by the management;
