working to raise landowner awareness of water stewardship principles and environmental impacts on the lakes within the area. The student will contribute to the stewardship and outreach work at Watersheds Canada by maintaining our native plant garden. Our Natural Edge shoreline naturalization program houses and grows plants used for our shoreline plantings. The gardener will be working outdoors at our office in Perth and will be responsible for growing and maintaining plants and general garden maintenance.

Primary Responsibilities:

- Potting and growing bareroot stock.
- Identifying native plants and organizing the garden by different species.
- Potting wildflowers.
- Watering bareroot and potted stock.
- Weeding the garden and potted stock.
- Fence maintenance (painting, etc.)
- Create a shaded area for shade plants.
- Lay mulch and landscape cloth as needed.
- Undertake administrative duties necessary for the execution of field work, including documentation of activities and reporting.
- Assist in the distribution of information packages.
- Conduct fieldwork, analyze data and interpret results.
- Develop copy for outreach materials and content creation for social media, blogs, and videos.
- Represent the project, the proponent and partners at environmental events.
- Promote our program and engage new landowners in shoreline naturalization projects.
- Assembling and distributing Natural Edge shoreline renaturalization starter kits to participating shoreline property owners in the Perth area.
- Perform other duties assigned.

Additional Responsibilities:

- Support other project components and staff as assigned by the management
- Act as a spokesperson for the organization

Some College or University, with preference given to those with a specialization in Natural Resources Management, Environmental Studies/Science or Biology.

Experience:

None required, however preference will be given to those with some experience in the conservation and/or non-profit sector(s).
