Ice fishing: How to prepare for a safe and enjoyable day of winter angling

WHAT IS ICE FISHING?

Ice fishing is the practice of catching fish through holes drilled in the ice of standing bodies of water. Since there is no casting involved and no boats needed, ice fishing can be a great way to introduce kids to fishing!

PACKING LIST

Gear - MUSTS

GOOD BOOTS, and the rest of your winter gear - dress in layers
extra socks + mitts
Some way of opening the ice
- hatchet, bar, auger
Ice scoop to clean the hole
A line with a hook and bait or lure
Cellphone
Clean drinking water, dry snacks
Toilet paper
Heat packs/ hand warmers (reusable or not)
Small medical kit
Good metal shovel **or 2**

Gear - maybes

Extra battery pack/booster pack
Shelter – tent or shack, vehicle
Heat source, fuel for heat source, CO detector
Chairs
Recovery straps (no chain!)
Keep feet off the ice – interlocking foam mats, floor mat from your car, pop crates, chunk of firewood
Electronics – fish finder
Cooking device
Lip Grippers
Bucket potty
Boot Cleats
Ice picks – up your sleeves

Fun Extras

Skates, helmet
Music / portable speaker
Make games on ice – snow block toss
Your well-behaved dog
Outdoor fire pit / firewood
A group of friends
Thermos of hot chocolate
Kid's tablet

DURING YOUR OUTING...

- Check the ice thickness as you go using a spud bar, hatchet, or auger, referencing thickness guidelines.
- Use GPS to navigate as sometimes there are no landmarks and the skies darken early in the winter.
- Use a shelter if needed, and a carbon monoxide meter if using combustion stove/light.
- Implement responsible fish handling. Handle with care, release quickly, or kill humanely if keeping.
- Stay warm and have fun!
