

Ice fishing: How to prepare for a safe and enjoyable day of winter angling

WHAT IS ICE FISHING?

Ice fishing is the practice of catching fish through holes drilled in the ice of standing bodies of water. Since there is no casting involved and no boats needed, ice fishing can be great way to introduce kids to fishing!

Ice picks - up your sleeves

DURING YOUR OUTING...

- Check the ice thickness as you go using a spud bar, hatchet, or auger, referencing thickness guidelines.
- Use GPS to navigate as sometimes there are no landmarks and the skies darken early in the winter.
- Use a shelter if needed, and a carbon monoxide meter if using combustion stove/light.
- Implement responsible fish handling. Handle with care, release quickly, or kill humanely if keeping.
- Stay warm and have fun!
